



## PE and Sports Premium for Primary Schools

For the academic year 2017/18 we will receive a grant of £17, 790, from the Government. This is used to ensure the high quality provision of PE at Hermitage.

How we intend to use our extra funding at Hermitage Primary School:

We are using £1500 to pay for a complete assessment package (Amaven) and lesson bank and lesson support programme (Sportscape) to be implemented from FS to Year 6. The lessons are suited to the ability of the class based on termly assessments.

£3969.00 will be used to fund a range of sports clubs to provide broader opportunities for the children to try different sports beyond the National Curriculum e.g. Archery.

This ensures all children are able to attend, if they wish and that they have the opportunity to partake in a variety of sports led by specialist coaches – e.g. archery, gymnastics, Ultimate Frisbee.

The funding will continue to contribute towards the Holmes Chapel and District Community Partnership of schools. HCDCP employs a specialist teacher from HCCS to co-ordinate a timetable of activities throughout the year and unites the cluster schools through sporting events. This specialist also visits Hermitage to teach extra PE lessons. (£10 x pupil = £2040)

A portion of the funding will be used to ensure PE resources are accessible to all and are of high quality – approximately £1000).

Throughout the year an audit of skills will be carried out. The funding will also pay for staff training during staff meetings and INSETs, based on the audit, to ensure all teaching staff at Hermitage are confident in all areas of the PE curriculum, thus continuing to offer high quality PE



lessons at Hermitage. Some of the funding will also be used to pay for bespoke training for staff where they will be involved in joint lesson planning and delivery as well as lessons where they are mentored through the lesson process. (approximate costs £1000 per member of staff x10)

## Making a difference to sport participation and attainment at Hermitage

By offering a wider range of sports clubs we aim to encourage the participation of more children to try different sporting activities.

**UPDATE: By the beginning of October (5.10.17) we have already seen an increase in the amount of children enthusiastically taking part in before and after school sports clubs.**

By using a standardised PE assessment we are able to monitor progress and ensure lessons are adapted appropriately for the needs of each class thus increasing and ensuring high attainment.

By completing a skills audit we are able to ensure teaching staff are confident in all areas of the PE curriculum and can therefore continue to deliver high quality lessons where children make progress.

By providing whole staff and bespoke training (based on the skills audit) we can ensure pupils receive high quality lessons and that this is sustainable as the staff can continue to provide this beyond the training.

By continuing to pay the Partnership contributions, the children at Hermitage are able to access a range of inter-school sports, including Boccia and new-age kurling.

Partnership contributions also help the Year 6 children particularly with their transition to secondary school.

**How these initiatives are being maintained at Hermitage**



The initiatives will be maintained through the staff training programme, which will be based on a skills audit.

The initiatives will inspire children to try different sports which we hope they will then continue.

The lesson bank will develop teachers' skills and increase the range and breadth of activities, which will in turn improve the quality of lessons in the long term.

The sports funding has been promised until 2020. We will continue to build on the impact of funding through this grant, embedding the provision for all pupils, ensuring it has the biggest impact and is of the most benefit to the children at Hermitage Primary School.

The assessments will ensure progress is monitored and children's physical fitness is tracked, building a basis for a life-long focus and awareness of fitness.
